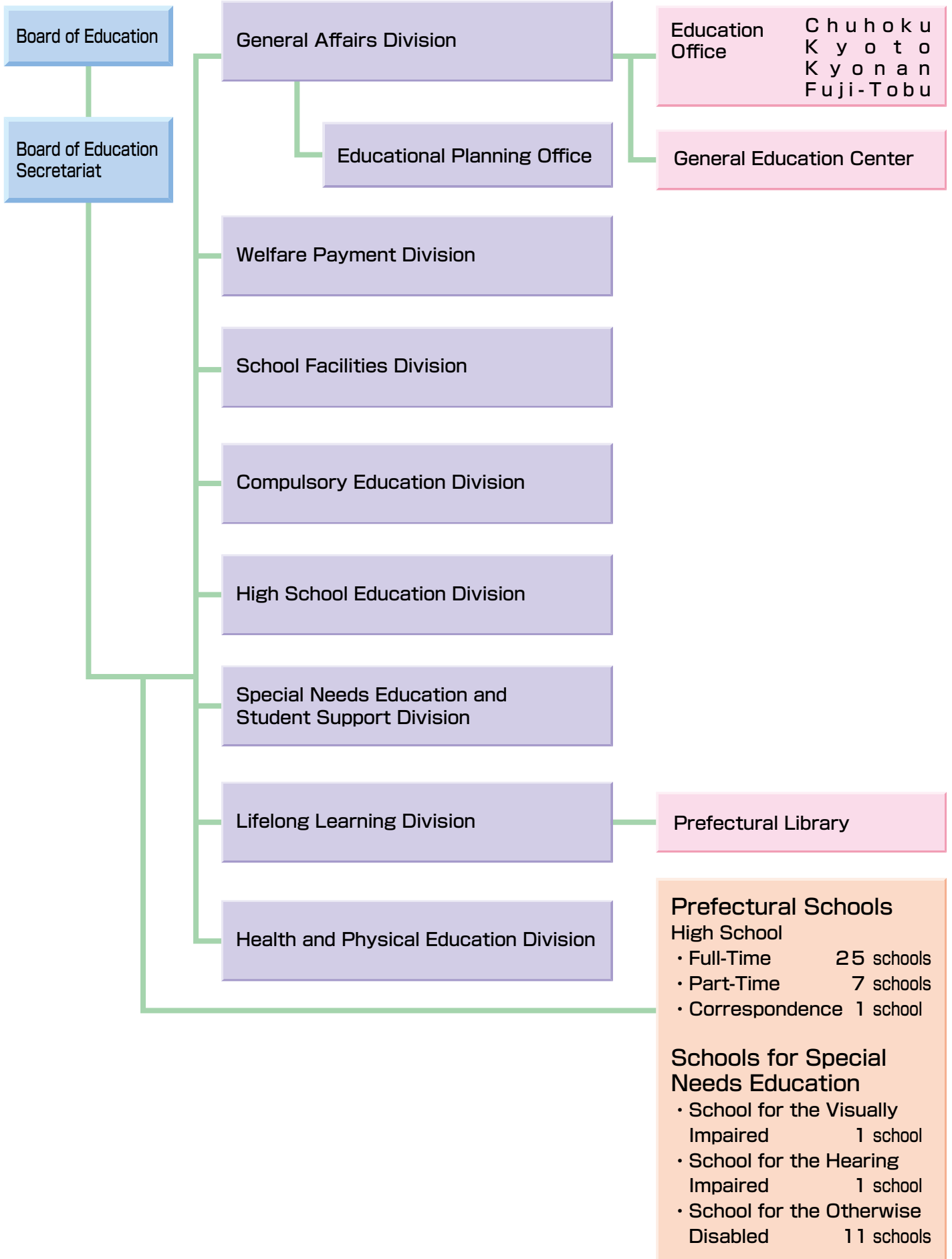

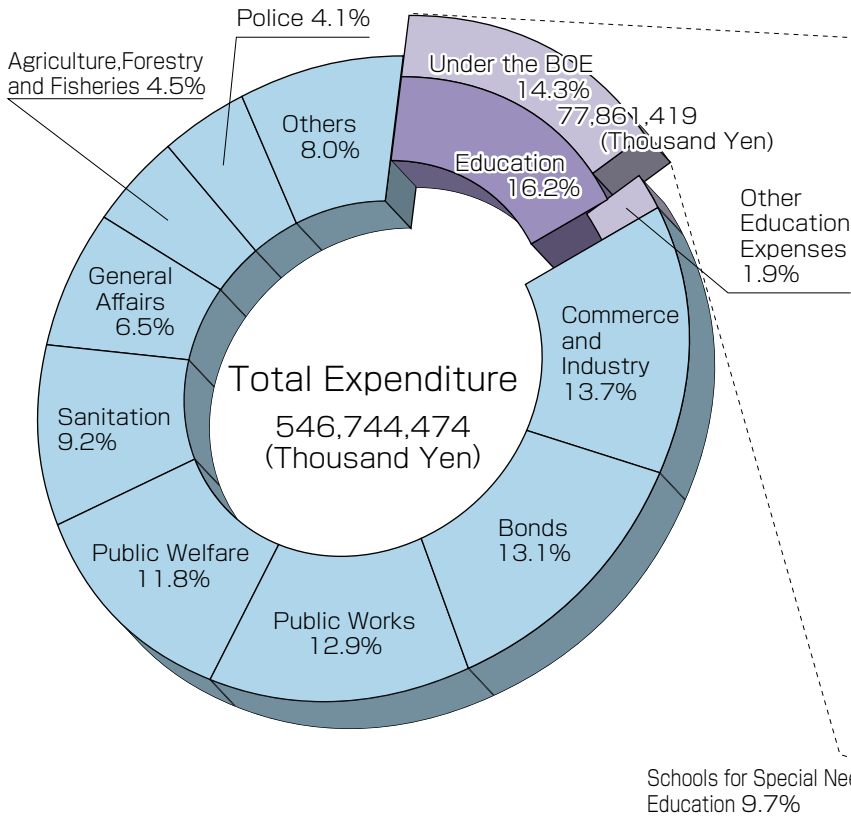

Yamanashi Prefectural Board of Education Organization Chart (As of April 1, 2022)

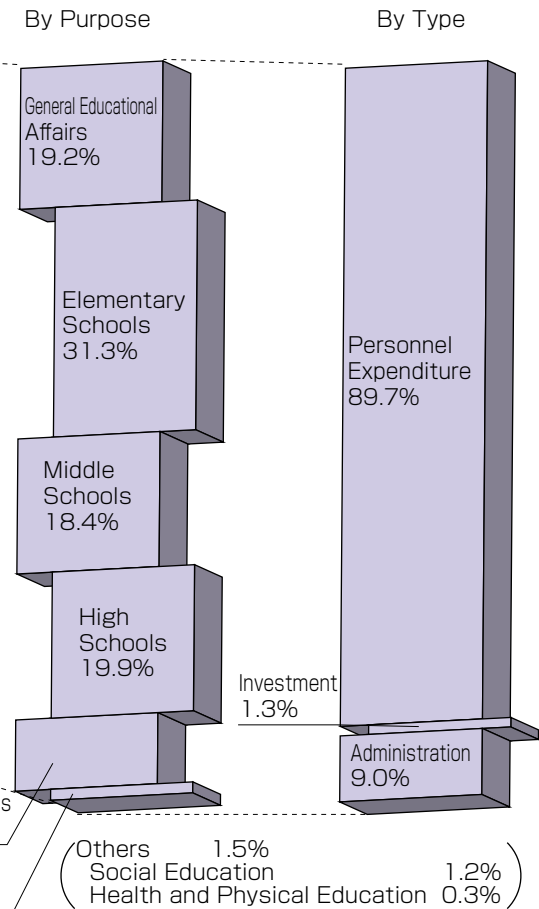

Breakdown of the Prefectural Budget and Education Expenditure (2022 Fiscal Year)



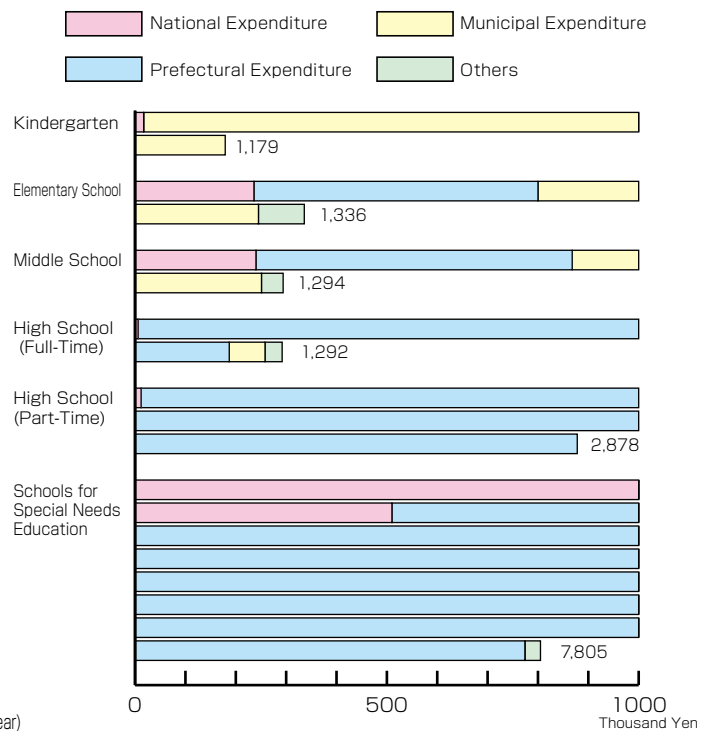
Education Spending (BOE) Breakdown



Trends in Prefectural Budget and Education Expenditure

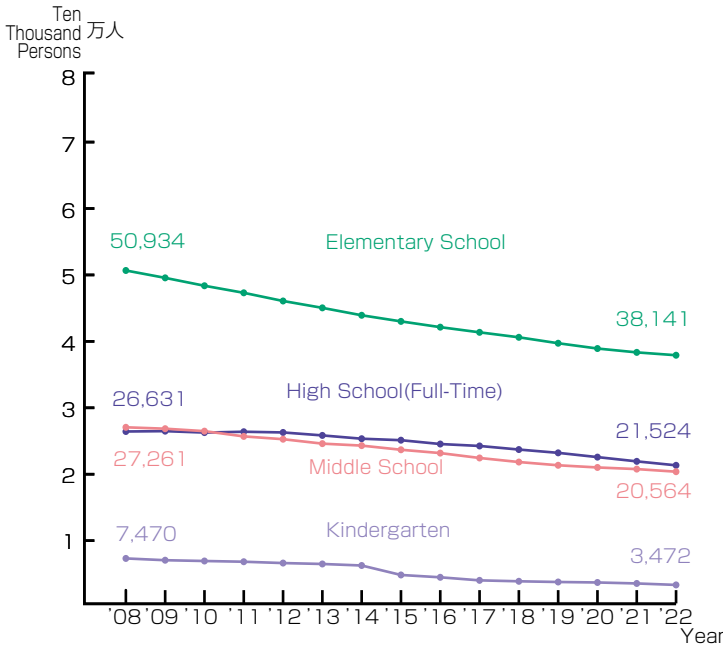


Education Expenditure per Child (Public School/Public Funds) (2020 Fiscal year)

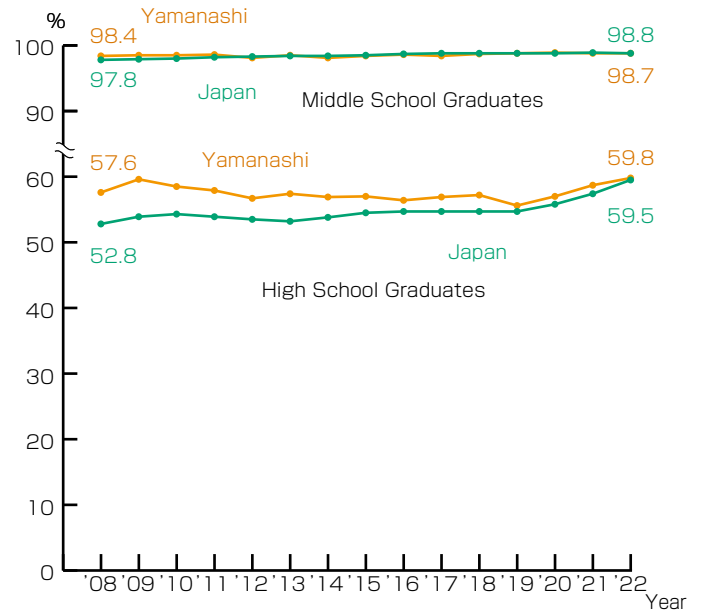

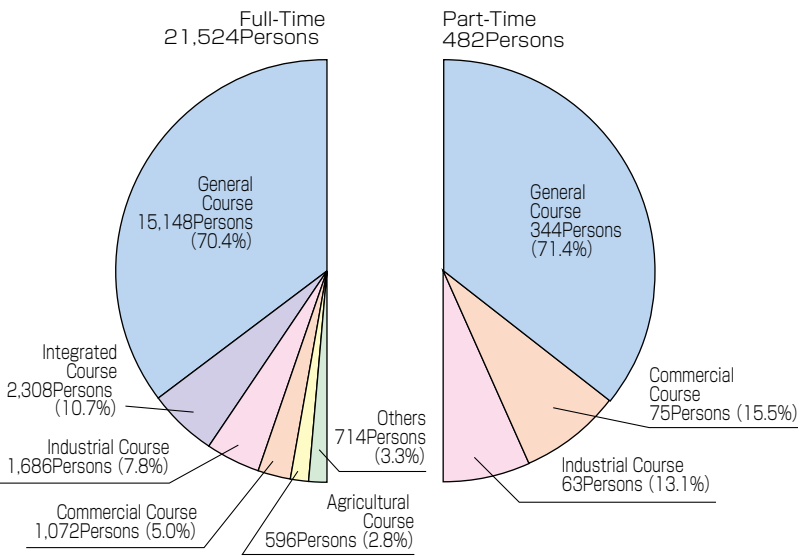
Trends in School Enrollment(National/Public/Private Schools)
(As of Every First of May)



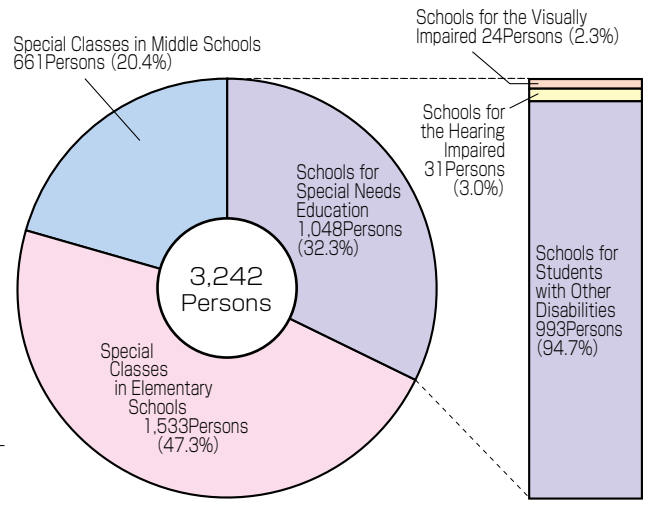
Trends in Percentage of Students Matriculating to Higher Levels of Education(National/Public/Private Schools)



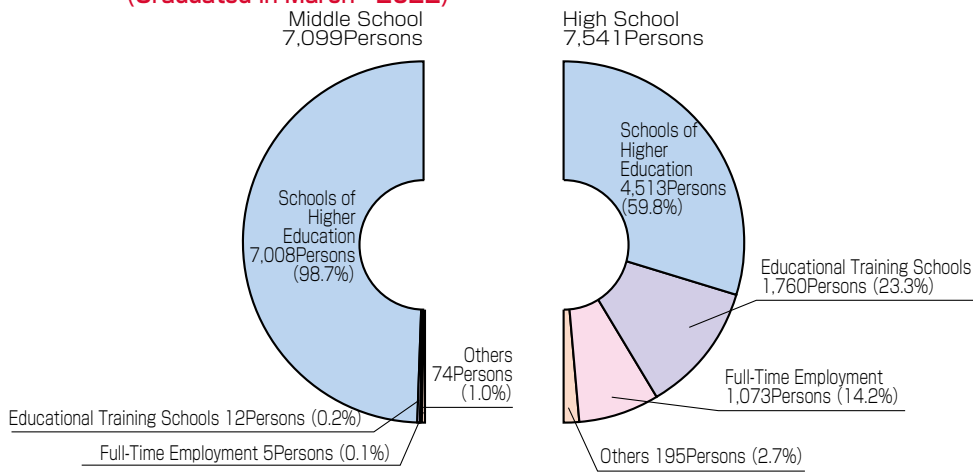
Number and Percentage of the Distribution of High School Students by Type of Course(Public/Private Schools) (As of May 1, 2022)



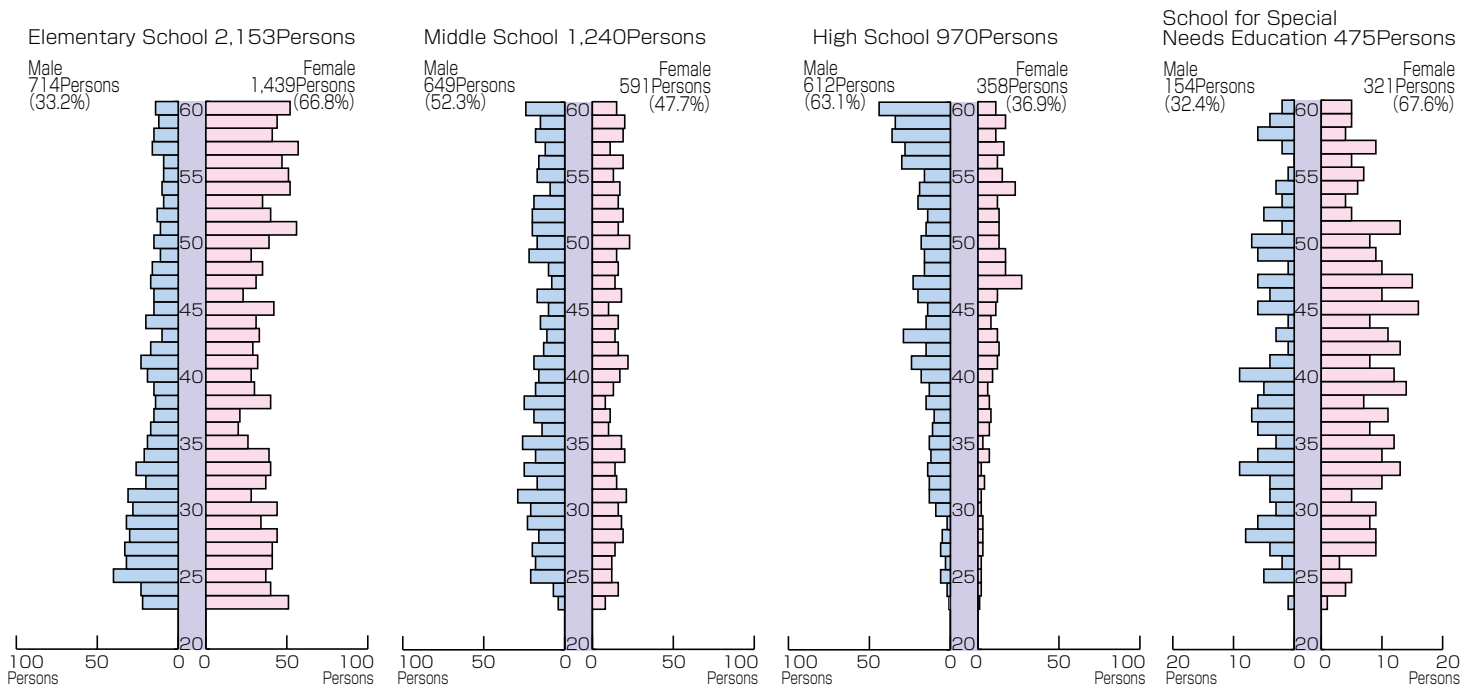
Enrollment of Children with Disabilities(National/Public Schools) (As of May 1, 2022)



Career Option Taken by Graduates (National/Public/Private Schools) (Graduated in March 2022)



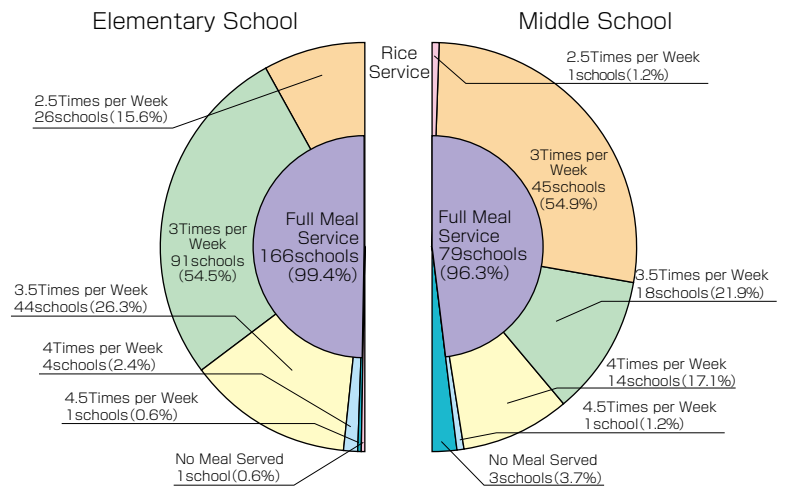
Age Distribution of Teachers(Public School) (As of May 1, 2022)



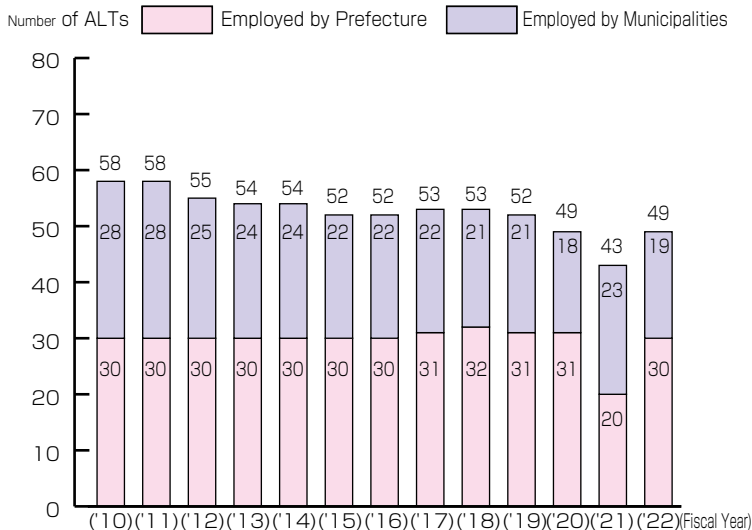

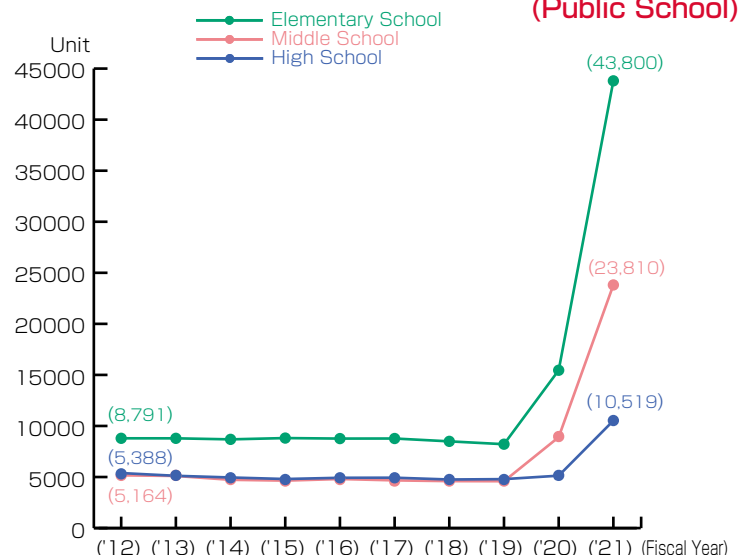
School Lunch Implementation Status(Public School) (As of May 1, 2021)

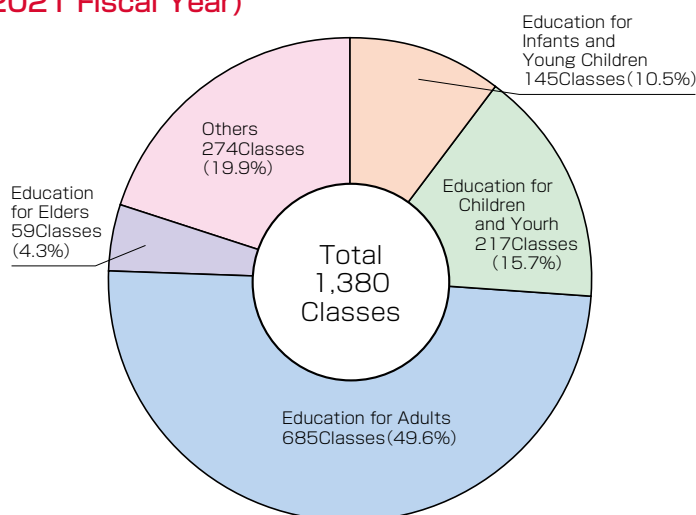
